# News From the Storefront

We have earned bragging rights when it comes to the Thrift Store. Our customers tell us that it is the nicest thrift in Las Cruces – and we agree!

Under the management of Ismael Lujan and his team of assistants and wonderful volunteers, we have grown your store into a fine establishment. Proceeds from the sales at the store support the major portion of the operating budget for the sanctuary. This year we added a TV monitor on which we show rotating photographs from the sanctuary. We have put an emphasis on the animals at the sanctuary in order to make sure the shoppers know where their money is going.

Thanks to your support, we recently added another 600 square feet of space to the store. This will be primarily used for furniture. Please keep us in mind when you are looking for a home for that gently used couch, chair, or other household item and don't forget that we now pick up large items.

# IF ANYTHING HAPPENED TO YOU, what would happen to me?

Thousands of companion animals are surrendered to animal shelters due to the death or disability of the pet owners who had cared for them. Many healthy, adoptable pets are euthanized simply because the pet owners did not plan for the possibility that their pets might outlive them.

There are a number of things pet owners can do to ensure that, if something happens to them, their pets will be cared for. Owners should identify caregivers who can care for their pets, maintain written care instructions, and set up a finance plan or set aside a fund to cover the care of their pets.

#### Step 1 - Identify Caregivers

Identify people who could step in to take short term care of your pets in the hours, days or weeks after an emergency, or who would adopt your pets should you die or become incapacitated. If you cannot find friends, relatives, or neighbors to care for your pets, your veterinarian and local pet sitters might be able to help you locate potential caregivers. Safe Haven Animal Sanctuary can also be contacted as a place for your pet to go to.

# Step 2 – Prepare written instructions outlining how your pets should be cared for

How do you want your pets to live - in another household or in a sanctuary? What kind

of special care do your pets require? Do you want your pets to stay together? To make sure that your wishes are followed, your instructions must be written down and someone must know where to find them.

# Step 3 – Set up a fund specifically for the care of your pets

You currently pay for food, shelter, supplies and medical care for your pets. Those expenses will not stop, even if you aren't here to pay them. You may want to set aside funds for temporary or foster care, transportation to a new home and the ongoing care of your pets.

Safe Haven has limited capacity and intake is based upon available space. If you decide that Safe Haven is your place of choice for your pets, plan a visit to the sanctuary and verify your decision. Safe Haven's mission is to adopt healthy animals into new homes so keep that in mind also as you make your decision. Additionally, consider engaging an attorney to finalize any arrangements you make. It will take a little leg work, but it will be comforting to know that you can provide for your beloved pets if and when you are no longer around.

### **Safe Haven Receives Rotarian Grant**

Recently Safe Haven was awarded a \$2,000 grant from the Mesilla Valley Rotary Club. This grant was made for the purchase of much-needed shade trees at the Sanctuary. We were able to purchase 9 trees and supplies, including installation, with the money. The trees will provide shade to those dog pens that receive the most summer sun.

# **Paw News from the Director**

Animal overpopulation in Doña Ana County is a situation that is constantly in need of being brought under control. With the Animal Services Center always over capacity - they see a euthanasia rate of over 50% - and with Safe Haven constantly at capacity and turning numerous animals away every day, dealing with this situation is a challenge. In an effort to reduce these numbers the Coalition for Pets & People (CFPP) has formed, with a goal of "Zero in Seven". This translates to zero euthanazations by 2019.

The group is comprised of representatives from all animal organizations in the area, including Safe Haven. There is a core council and a number of committees that deal with varying areas of concern. The group has received funding of \$48,000 under a Doña Ana County contract, which will get the effort started. One focus is on Animal Control officers in the field being able to waive citations in return for the owner having their pet neutered, free of charge, and showing proof of same. A building is being sought in which to perform free and low-cost animal sterilization. Micro-chip scanners for Animal Control officers in the Sunland Park area are also under consideration. A marketing committee is taking shape and will work on publicity for the group. It is an admirable and challenging effort but one that is surely needed.

There are a number of cities in the nation that have had outstanding results in reducing pet over-population and it is hoped that the Coalition will incorporate some of those practices as they might pertain to this area. It would be gratifying indeed to see the overpopulation situation brought under control in the not too distant future.

Safe Haven continues to promote adoptions and awareness of the sanctuary facility and is actively seeking volunteer foster families to reduce some of the burden of in-take. Be sure to mention Safe Haven to your family, friends and neighbors. There are Safe Haven bumper stickers available at the store and the sanctuary if you would like to support us by placing one on your vehicle.

# Cancer Study in Dogs May Benefit Humans

An innovative cancer treatment process is improving the survival rates for dogs with cancer. The American Kennel Club Canine Health Foundation funded a ground-breaking study using expanded T-cells to help extend the lives of dogs that have lymphoma cancer, the most common canine cancer.

The research is being performed by a team of scientists at Texas A&M and the University of Texas MD Anderson Children's Cancer Hospital in Houston. A blood sample is drawn from a dog who has cancer. The white cells (T-cells), which are critical to fight infection and control cancer, are expanded and infused back into the same dog after chemotherapy treatment to help rebuild the dog's immune system. The hypothesis of the study was that the infused cells would wipe out any remaining cancer cells not eliminated during typical chemotherapy treatments. The early results are encouraging.

Dogs are genetically closer to humans than humans are to mice. Cancer in dogs develops in a similar way to human cancers. Given the promising results of this treatment with dogs, a similar trial in immunotherapy process is currently in clinical trials to help treat human cancer patients at MD Anderson Children's Cancer Hospital.

The U.S. Food & Drug Administration has approved using T-cell immunotherapy to treat humans for lymphoma. New trials stemming from this research are forthcoming.

# **Adopting the Neediest**

Laying out the welcome mat for unpopular pets – from the black cat to the blind dog – can be the start of a perfect relationship.



**River** is not a pretty kitty in the traditional sense. Found as a stray and brought to the sanctuary as a scrawny gray shorthair, she had suffered a few injuries that left her with a crooked ear and a forlorn expression on her face. Despite her appearance, she is an affectionate cat and will make a great companion to someone not focused on good looks but more on her gentle nature.



**Rusty,** a senior poodle who, in his old age, has become deaf, does fine with hand signals and has a great personality. We worry about him being in an outdoor pen during the cold winter nights. He is a happy old chap who also happens to be house-trained and gets along with other dogs and cats.



**Loopy** was surrendered as the only surviving kitten from a litter whose Momma had feline distemper. After some testing it was discovered that she suffers from a condition called Cerebellar Hypoplasia. This leaves her with some jerky movements and an inability to walk. She is undergoing physical therapy and has already shown very small or modest improvement in her ability to coordinate her movements. Loopy will be available for adoption

after her spay procedure but will need additional physical therapy to be administered in the home by the family.

"So many wonderful pets in need of homes are passed over because of stereotypes, myths and misinformation," says Jeff Barker, sanctuary manager. "People think they need a special skill set to take care of a deaf or blind pet, or, let's say, a pet with a missing limb, but pets like these oftentimes compensate so well, you forget their handicaps".

There is still this vast subset of animals perceived as unadoptable. Pitbull type dogs, FIV positive cats, pets with black fur, deaf animals, senior animals – they are far too frequently overlooked. Safe Haven believes that every animal deserves a forever home. Some pets require that leap of faith that requires you to look beyond appearances. All are craving your love and that makes you more special for adopting them.


