Paw News from the Director

Well we have seen a very demanding kitten season this year. The Las Cruces area community has succeeded in producing an unprecedented number of unwanted cats, kittens and puppies. Calls come in continuously from people wanting to bring these poor creatures to Safe Haven. Knowing that the next stop for them is probably the Animal Services Center, makes it hard for us to turn them away. Our capacity dictates the number of intakes we can handle and the new cat isolation unit has aided this year in allowing us to take in kittens awaiting testing and vaccinations.

Success stories do exist though and that is what we focus on. Take the four three-week old kittens left in a box outside the Thrift Store. Thanks to the tender loving care given them, round the clock, by our assistant manager, Ruthie, they are thriving and happy playing together in the Cattery. When old enough, they will be spayed/neutered and then put up for adoption. In the meantime the staff and volunteers are enjoying their company.

Having foster families available to help out in situations such as this would enable us to save more lives. Please con-

sider becoming a foster family for a dog or cat so that one pet can have a second chance at life. We always try to match up the family with the right pet. Foster care is vital to saving lives of at-risk pets so please consider becoming a foster for SHAS. If you're new to fostering, mentoring and training is provided.

The Animal Cruelty Bill, SB62 carried by Sen. Mary Jane Garcia, failed to pass again in this year's legislative session. We'll be back next year, I'm sure.

Safe Haven is participating in the newly formed Coalition for Pets & People. In its formative stages, the Coalition's goal is to turn Las Cruces into a "no kill" community within 7 years. Modeling after other successful cities, the group has formed a number of diverse committees, each reporting to the Core Council which, in turn, is forming the strategy for the "Zero in Seven" goal. Stay tuned for more from this group.




Having too much fun......

Yogi was scheduled to be euthanized but those plans were changed when two angels decided he deserved a second chance at life.


